The Australian Association of Teachers of Korean invites abstract submissions for in person presentations from established scholars, early career researchers, postgraduate students, and Korean language education practitioners for the 2023 AUATK Korean Language Teacher Workshop, to be held on 16 December 2023 at the Korea Education Centre, Sydney. The event is generously supported by the Korea Education Centre in Sydney and by the Secondary College of Languages.

Participation and Abstract Submission

The 2023 Workshop will feature a series of presentations on practical aspects of Korean language teaching. The organising committee welcomes abstract submissions dealing with all aspects of Korean language teaching. However, when reviewing the submitted abstracts, priority will be given to those presentations that aim to introduce the audience to:

- cutting-edge teaching approaches;
- advanced teaching techniques and activities;
- innovative and contemporary learning material development;
- case studies of new learning programs;
- case studies of language testing and curriculum design; and
- other practical aspects relevant to the Korean language classroom.

Travel Grants

A limited number of travel grants are available for interstate participants. The travel grant will include:

- Partial refund of air ticket (amount depending on final funding).
- Two-night accommodation.

Due to the limited funding available, priority for travel grants will be given to presenting interstate participants (including interstate teachers, HDR students, and casual academics). Participants from NSW, international participants and established academics (on a fixed-term or ongoing contract) will not be eligible for a travel grant.

Registration

The organisers will waive conference registration fees for all participants. However, participants are required to be 2023 AUATK members or to join the Association upon participating in the event (membership fees are A\$40 for academics and teachers, and A\$20 for MA/PhD students).
